### PASTOR'S CORNER

Can anyone withhold the water for baptizing these people, who have received the Holy Spirit even as we have?

It might sound a little odd to have St. Peter baptizing people after they've received the Holy Spirit. It seems like baptism was not needed to receive God's grace. It seems like baptism then becomes just a symbol because God's grace is already there.

But traditionally we talk about three parts of a sacrament: the symbol, the reality it brings about, and the grace it effects (traditionally called the *sacramentum tantum*, the *res et sacramentum*, and the *res tantum*). So in baptism, the symbol is the pouring of water and the words "I baptize you..."; the reality is a seal or indelible mark on our soul that changes us and always remains to guarantee our relationship to God; the effect is that sanctifying grace that allows us to enter into eternal life.

God had given us the sacraments and expects us to make use of them, but God is not limited to the sacraments: God is free to bestow his grace where he sees fit. God can bestow the grace of baptism without there being any water involved. And the Church even officially recognizes this in the cases of "baptism by fire" when someone is martyred for Christ before baptism and "baptism by desire" when someone has explicitly sought baptism and dies before it is possible. God bestowed his grace upon Cornelius and his household just from hearing St. Peter speak. But if St. Peter had left it at that, they would not have received that permanent sacramental reality: there would have been no indelible mark on their souls.

The reality of the sacrament seals us in that grace. It means that even when I sin and turn away from God, his gifts remain ready to be enlivened again through Reconciliation. This is why we are never rebaptized! For Cornelius and his household, faith and the gifts of the Holy Spirit had been received, but they needed to be sealed with sacraments so that those graces might always be present.

The symbol of the sacrament, which causes the reality and grace that it signifies, also gives us a physical event we can always remember. Am I a member of the Church? Well... I had the cool experience of the Holy Spirit once... Ah, but then I was baptized – water was poured, the words were said – and Jesus taught his disciples that through baptism they would be joined to him in his body the

Church. I know I am a member of his Church because I trust Jesus' words and the sacramental event happened through the ministry of the Church.

As we celebrate First Communion this weekend and look forward to confirmation in the coming weeks, may we rejoice in the gift of the sacraments: the symbolic events themselves, the new realities they bring about, and the grace God bestows upon us through them.
